KPU RICHMOND FARM SCHOOL, KPU INSTITUTE OF SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE BETTY GIRARD, SCHOLARSHIP FUND COMMITTEE

We have had a record year for donations in 2024. Thank you for your support! We are now looking forward to next year and we shared our goals for 2025 at the fall meeting.

The scholarship committee has had the KPU Richmond Farm School on our radar for the last three years. We support 12 different horticultural programs, from graduate studies to certificates, but we have not added a new program since 2018.

The committee had an opportunity to tour the Richmond KPU Farm School in October and we were

very impressed with the students, the faculty, and the goals of the program. It is a 10-month 'hands on' program that shows participants how to succeed in small scale organic agriculture. Mentorship is a cornerstone of this program.

Our goal is to support the KPU Farm School in 2025 and beyond if funds allow. We estimate that our fund would need to grow by \$10,000 in 2025 to sustainably support a new scholarship moving forward.


Congratulations to the Best in Show winner, Sherri Summers, for her entry 'Contortionism,' an all foliage design.
